# Alcohol Awareness Week 17th - 23rd November 2014

Join the thousands that will pledge to do something positive during this week of alcohol action.

- This year we are getting behind the new North West investigation, "Let's Look Again At Alcohol", which uncovers how we are failing to protect children from the negative consequences of alcohol. New research found 1 in 5 survey respondents knew of a child or children who had been negatively affected as a result of other people's drinking.
- We will be asking adults across the city to take part in the 'Drink Wise Challenge' to find out what

## The Greater Manchester Alcohol Strategy 2014-2017

Greater Manchester's councils, health services and the police have officially teamed up to tackle alcohol misuse in Greater Manchester.

This is the first time ever in the UK that such a large number of public bodies have united to launch a joint effort to deal with the problems caused by alcohol harm.

The overarching purpose of the Greater Manchester Alcohol Strategy will be to reduce demand on public services and address complex dependency issues through early intervention and prevention activity. Find out more here

A joint report on <u>Alcohol and Brain Damage in Adults</u> was published earlier this year highlighting how alcohol misuse can cause changes to people's brain function and intellect, including the impact of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD).

The Lesbian and Gay Foundation published the findings of <u>Part of the Picture (POTP)</u> this year - a five year study exploring alcohol and drug use among lesbian, gay and bisexual people in England.
